I was delighted to read the Washington Star article about you and The Tortilla Factory. I just knew that it had to be a person and not a machine that made that marvelous difference.


When my husband and I moved to the D.C. area three years ago from San Antonio I was about to return to making my own tortillas because all I found tasted like shoe leather.

They are even better than South Texas tortillas.


